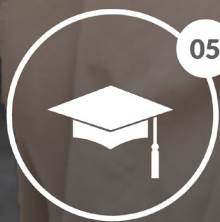

Introduction to TASS



Tadamun Social Society (TASS) is a National, Non-Governmental Organization (NGO), Non-profit agency operating in Somalia, it was established in 1992 by national intellectuals who felt the importance and the need in the region of such an NGO to contribute social wellbeing. TASS is one of the largest humanitarian and development organizations in Puntland –Somalia, our headquarters is Bosaso and our sub-offices are in Mogadishu, Garowe, Gardo and Galkaio, its beneficiaries include IDPs, host community and refugees including children.

To alleviate human suffering, build resilience, foster growth and development towards a stable society where all people meet their needs and enjoy their rights.

› TASS SUPPORTED COMMUNITY SCHOOLS

Good education makes an individual develop personal intelligent, socially as well as economically. Education helps us to acquire new skills and knowledge that will impact our development in life, it managed 22 community schools with more than 8,000 students in different regions of Puntland in close collaboration with communities and ministry of education these were previously established by TASS to cover the education needs of the communities, these schools are mainly supported by the community who contribute the teachers' incentives.

› Key Achievements

TASS ensured provision of quality education through investing & monitoring of teaching and learning process in these schools it provided technical expertise in service-teaching training for 40 junior teachers, supported development of school improvement plans, trained 150 community education committee members in different locations to support school sustainability, constructed 5 new classrooms in Nawawi school in Garowe, it also provided sanitation materials wheel barrows, brooms, shovels and soap for each of these schools. TASS furnished 20 classrooms in Bosaso and Garowe. One of the main remarkable success of TASS supported schools ranked among the top 10 leading students in centralized exams in the national level exams likely the school's enrollment increases from 8,256 to 8,773 students (4,462 boys and 4,311 girls)



Somalia Girl Education Promotion Project - Transition (SOMGEP-T)

The Somali Girls Education Promotion Project – Transition Window (SOMGEP T) - Kobcinta Waxbarashada Gabdhaha in Somali –works with schools, communities, individual students, religious leaders and Ministries of Education (MoEs). This project will seek to increase the demand for secondary education, continuing a process of transformative change in gender and social norms; boost local capacity to support its costs; and partner with the local governments and communities to build adequate and sustainable opportunities for girls living in remote areas to transition into post-primary education.

Our target schools were 31 schools 20 primary schools and 11 secondary schools through supporting marginalized girls from some of the poorest, most vulnerable and marginalized households in remote and rural areas of Sanaag, Karkaar & Haylan.

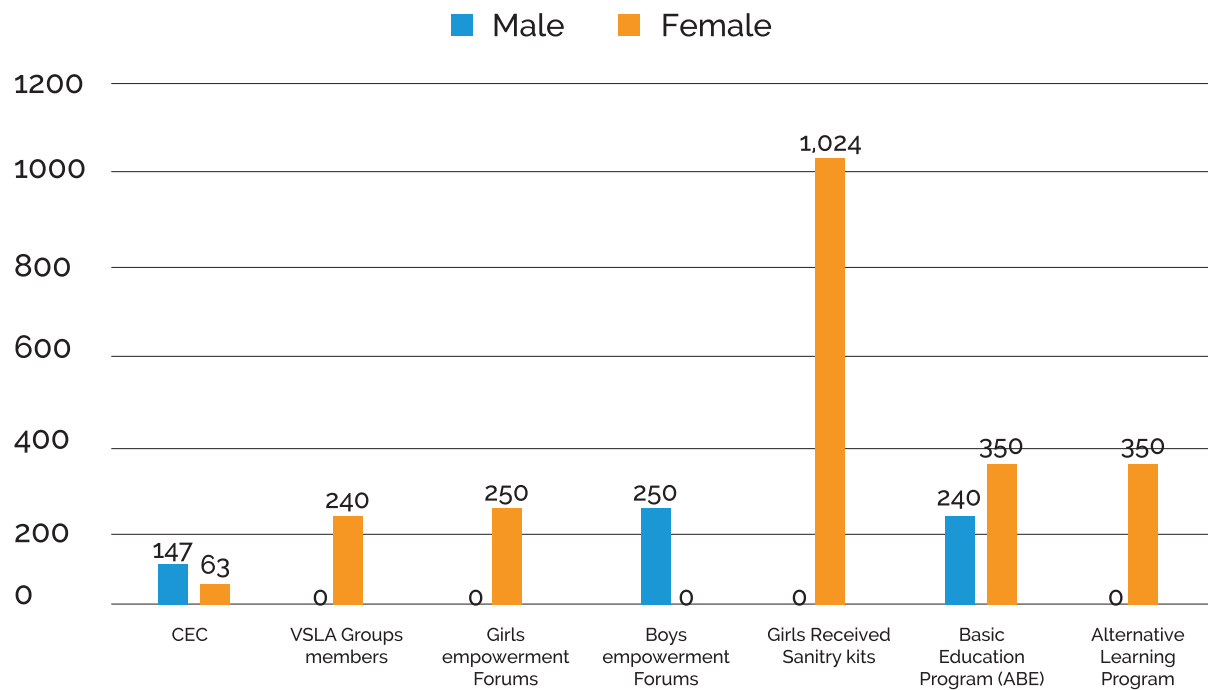
› Key Achievements

TASS enhanced the capacity of 210 CEC members (63 female and 147 male) through facilitating development of CEC Roles & responsibilities, school leadership, enrollment campaign, child rights and inclusive education & gender in education. Empowered CEC members applied their skills in school management and supervision and contributed school enrolment increase and gender equality in education through communal action led CECs. Likely mothers in target school villages supported to establish and coached 12 Village Saving loan association (VSLA) groups with members of 240 women who received proper business management skills and grant of 500USD to start up small businesses after submission of their business plans.

During the project implementation TASS established and trained Boys empowerment forums (BEF) and Girls empowerment forums (GEF) with 500 members (250 girls and 250 boys) in targeted schools to support child protection and rights awareness in schools. On the other hand 1,014 girls received sanitary kits this helped the girls to retain classrooms even during menstrual period and improved girls' attendance. Through consul-

tation meetings wider communities received detailed information about disabilities and its types to avoid discrimination. Alternative Basic Education program (ABE) interventions surpassed 600 students (240 boys and 360 girls) the regular class size as many learners enrolled for the ABE program who were among the drought affected people and lost their livelihood. Alternative Learning Program 350 female learners became motivated and expecting to reintegrate the learning institutes, college and formal schools in 2020. In addition, this project supported formulation school improvement plan (SIP) for every school with support of school head teachers and CEC members.

Summary of SOMGEP-T Project Beneficiaries





Integrated Project Education and Protection Project



To eliminate low level awareness of child protection and child education, after assessment TASS selected 16 schools from drought affected areas in Bari and Sanag regions with approval of MoEHE, the selected schools were in rural villages and had no feeding programme, learning teaching materials, teachers incentives, trained CECs hence affecting children’s ability to effectively and actively attend and participate in learning programmes. Furthermore 11 out of the 16 targeted schools did not have water storage and urgently needed water for drinking and sanitation. Expanding access to Education in Emergencies and Facilitating child protection services for Children affected by Emergencies, the project supported by SHF its education component targeted 2,900 students (1,628 boys and 1,272 girls) of primary school-aged children in drought-affected IDP and community schools This project improved the capacity of existing public schools to cater to the educational needs of drought-affected IDP children as well as vulnerable children from host communities.

› Key Achievements

The project ensured inclusivity and sustainability of the project, TASS improved the coordination and information sharing with the concerned line ministries such as Ministry of Education and Ministry of Women Development & Family Affairs (MOWDAFA), Education and Protection clusters. In addition this project built on local capacities and ensured the beneficiaries effectively manage their schools during the crisis and avoid disruption of education services to their children. This project also safeguarded the child protection and provided children access to their right including education. TASS provided scholastic learning Materials and monthly school ration feeding programme to 2,900 children in all target schools in addition TASS trained 48 (24 male, 24 female) Community Education Committees (CECs) from 16 targeted schools for three days on their roles and responsibilities in school management and managing education in crises to ensure that learning is not interrupted during conflict or in times of crises, including child rights, child protection, water manage-

ment, hygiene and sanitation of schools, TASS provided monthly incentives for 48 primary schools teachers in targeted schools. It also provided 11 PVC water storage tanks with capacity of 2000 ltrs to 11 school which lacked water storages. In collaboration with the ministry of education trained 48 school teachers for three days on Pedagogy. Key areas of focus were teachers preparation, (lesson planning/scheming/record keeping) classroom instruction and student assessment. TASS also provided sanitary kits to 600 adolescent girls. In addition there has been child protection component that supported 3,800 children and improved the capacity of CECs and teachers in protection aspects through workshops, establishment of child right clubs in targeted schools and provision psychosocial support and medical support and referral for further services. Finally this project created protective environment with quality education for children, and increased enrollment and furthermore it enabled duty bearers to sustain the education in emergency context.

Health and Nutrition



During this year under review, Bosaso TB control center improved diagnostic capability with technological interventions, ameliorating educational programs for health care personnel, rising awareness among community, patients and providing free treatment and nutritious food for patients and Provision of HIV services through HIV tests in the center. Due to the high-cost of films, chest-X-ray was relegated as third-level diagnostic tool for both negative AFB and Xpert MTB/RIF patients. All patients who started a TB treatment underwent follow up visits and Acid- Fast Bacilli (AFB) test at one, two, five and six months. TASS in close collaboration with Puntland MoH has successfully managed the center services through professional and skilled health staff.

› Key Achievements

Bosaso TB Control center continued an effort to diagnose and treat more cases of TB and MDR-TB was the expansion of access to high-quality TB control services, 1, 977 (1,274: M; 703 :F) cases registered on outpatient, - Out of 1,635 cases referred for diagnosis in the laboratory, 188 TB positive cases in the results. X-Ray machine examined 565 M-377 F- 188 but 29 were assumed positive. TB control staff under community outreach in rural and urban villages through conducting awareness raising on TB for 1680 people and diagnosed 240 people 27 of them were positive in this 2019. 444 M- 310 F- 134 were to undergo treatment. 385 cases of TB were tested for HIV. 11 cases were identified to be HIV+ve.

Nutrition & Emergency Health

This project of integrated management of health and Nutrition intervention is one of the key programs that the TASS has been carried out in 2019. It is intended to reduce the Malnutrition which is a significant public health concern in Somalia and has been, negatively affecting survival, growth and development of the children. This program has been providing integrated health and nutrition lifesaving services for affected communities in three rural districts namely Xudun, Taleex, Boocame and Tukaraq in the Sool region.

› Key Achievements

Improved and equitable access to and utilization of quality, high impact mother and child nutrition interventions results in reduced child mortality and morbidity. Around 6568 children received free services through screening, nourishing and treatment. 500 mothers trained on MUAC measurement learn how screen their children. 1,556 children (girls 855 and boys 701) between 6- 23 months had received mineral nutrient power (MNPs) which prevented them from anemia and malnutrition. In addition, TASS provided three Hemo Cue Hb machines to the best top three health facilities namely Boocame, Taleex, and Sarmanyo health centers these improved the facility performances, the 716 community members including women, religious and traditional leaders received health education and empowerment through meetings this enabled the beneficiaries attend for services in targeted facilities. The project provided incentives of 61 health staff that served for the beneficiaries and trained 64 health workers Safe motherhood, Integrated management of childhood illnesses, Infant Young child feeding, Integrated Management of acute malnutrition with equipped them knowledge, skills and as well as their guidelines per health facility.

During the project period, TASS rehabilitated 11 targeted health facilities and two of them karingorfood and awbogeys received water tank each this improved the environment to be safe and clean. Children had a full medical examination and weight for height review weekly.

TASS also disseminated IEC materials to all 11 fixed health facilities including Bill boards and posters on key health and nutrition messages translated in local language this raised the community awareness on nutrition and health.

Protection



Creating and upholding protection environment for children, women and girls TASS has been running number of protection projects such as CBCP, Gender based violence elimination, FGM zero tolerance, Social Norms Participation Program, & Child rights governance (CRG) in various regions of Somalia.

As known Social norms around unacceptability of violence and respect for girls and women are weakened in the context of war, and population displacement may break down systems of social rewards and punishments that uphold those norms.

Community Based Child Protection (CBCP)

Provision of multi-sectorial services (Safe house, food and material support, PSS, cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT) and family reunification) to children and women survivors, this project covered 6 districts namely Bosaso, Garowe, Galkayo, Goldogob, Bocame and Buuhoodle of Bari, Nugal, Mudug, Sool and Ceyn regions of Puntland

> Key Achievements

TASS has improved its protection services in case management completely defining and following the process of case management from initial case registration to case closure. it enhanced the coordination among inter organizational referral system and coordination with line ministry, it carried out Community and school

awareness on CP/GBV prevention. 645 separated children & 295 unaccompanied children including 36 Ethiopian minors received IDTR services via offering shelter food and repatriation with their parents in child centered support process, and 148 women with GBV concerns received an appropriate support considering confidentiality, in case follow up sessions it was noted that all supported clients recovered from the concerns after accessing different protection services as per individual needs like medical, material and psychosocial supports, safe shelter and food and reparation and reunification of an accompanied minors. In addition, it raised the protection awareness of 1,364 school children in 8 schools through open CP mobilization sessions in their respective school compounds. Selected 16 community dialogue facilitators and trained to facilitate community dialogues at community level in Bosaso and Goldogob as pilot sites, in addition, TASS case workers raised community outreach CP and GBV community awareness for 2,902 participants in target districts.

Community Based Child Protection (CBCP)

This project intends to offer a comprehensive package intervention to achieve sustainable transformation towards greater social and economic empowerment for women and girls. The project aims to challenge gender discriminatory social norms at the structural, cultural and personal level and to deliver an appropriate mix of interventions to address Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) and Child Early and Forced Marriage (CEFM).

It aims to ensure that women's and girls' voices are heard and that they are able influence decision making on matters which affect their lives. To reflect the most important issues which they feel to be addressed in their community to create opportunities for women and girls in local and national level of decision making around harmful social norms and practice.

› Key Achievements

During this period, the project team reached total beneficiaries of 3,901 (812 men, 2,301 women, 324 boys and 464 girls), we established and trained civil society coalition members who then developed their own collective actions to end FGM and ECFM/GBV this protected the rights of women and girls in project locations, we also supported the implementation of CSO advocacy action plans in five villages under Badhan district of sanaga region this enhanced the community attitude change in abandonment of FGM. GBV working groups composing of members from CSOs health professionals, police lawyers and local municipal officers who actively engaged in monthly meetings to share updates of ongoing intervention and this improved coordination among stakeholders

Exchange and learning visits between Puntland and Jubaland project teams held this gave an opportunity to share experience of the project within these two federal states. CHOICE cycle sessions conducted in a weekly basis for young adolescent girls and boys aged between 10-14 years this empowered young chil-



dren's participation. TASS also established seven school clubs and supported their initiatives to reach out large number of community members with FGM abandonment awarenesses in Badhan and its surrounding villages reaching the community members of these villages Hingalol, Habarshire, Degmokher, Mindcir and BaliBusle. In this period, TASS held commemoration of FGM zero tolerance day in which it reached out big number of community members and distributed messages to raised community awareness on have negative attitudes on harmful practices FGM,CEFM & GBV again women and girls. Empowered men and boys who stood up protecting rights women and girls in target locations, the project also supported survivors providing emergency medical and material supports, finally the project established Village Savings and Loan Association (VSLA) groups and trained these group members have shown self-reliance and then TASS provided start up grants to 113 small business ideas selected VSLA groups

Child Right Governance (NORAD/ CRG) Project

Child rights governance works to ensure improvement of legal and policy environment for children through rectification of UNCRC and African Charter on the rights and welfare of the child and development and application of ACT and puntland plan of action for children through empowering policy makers (relevant government authorities), civil society, teachers, community members and children demonstrate improved knowledge, attitude and practice in promoting, respecting and protecting children's rights. Reduction of vulnerability to risks and hazards faced children in targeted schools and enabling Children, families and communities recognize the risks for violence, abuse, exploitation and neglect that children face and take action to protect or prevent them and access response services.

> Key Achievements

In this period the project reached 4,796 beneficiaries, the children were empowered to raise the views in schools and homes be heard during the project children ideas heard and accepted by parents and schools. Children with disabilities have been given a special consideration. Having given a three month mentoring and coaching sessions, then they showed change in attitude and have actively taken part in the major activities including interface with government officials and other school competition sessions some received awards. Thirty parents who attended Parenting without violence sessions have changed their behaviors in mistreating the children at home according to the children and parents.

The religious leaders who were trained have demonstrated Islamic perspective of children rights and mentioned that Islam advocates for the rights of children even before they are born (by encouraging the men to choose a good mother/wife for the unborn children).

Women with disabilities have been identified and empowered to coach and mentor school children with disabilities. They have so far conducted coaching and mentoring session. They said that this kind of effort have profound positive effect on their attitude towards and hopes in life.





Gender Based Violence (GBV) Intervention



This project titled Provision of emergency GBV prevention and Child protection services for Men, women, boys and girls in drought and conflict affected areas in Bari, Sanag and Sool Regions, aimed to contribute to Somalia HRP 2019 and TASS's efforts to support the drought- affected populations (Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) and host communities) in Sool, Sanaag and Bari regions through community based programming and strengthening of GBV and Child Protection response systems and promoting community cohesiveness which will promote community-based protection mechanism by ensuring women, men, girls and boys participate in community-based protection mechanisms/sessions.

› Key Achievements

Emergency medical support offered to vulnerable children and women with protection concerns reached 300 (137 Boys, 113 girls and 50 women), TASS also made identification, documentation and tracing and reunification (IDTR) for 150 (98 boys and 52 girls) Unaccompanied and separated children UASC in target areas. by covering the cost of transport and living costs during reunification process. Dignity kits provided to 100 women and girls who are risk of GBV composing of Set of Clothes (Dirac and Gorgorad), Sanitary pads, Soap for Clothes, Soap for Bathing, High quality Solar Lamp, Water Container(20Lt) and Bag (Proper packaging of Dignity kits using re-usable non polythene paper bag. To improve emotional wellbeing of drought affected students TASS has also provided individual and group psychosocial counselling, established school clubs and conducted recreational activities through provision of sporting materials such as football, sportswear, volley balls, volley ball bars plus net, basket balls, basketball net, football nets, jumping rope, football goal bars for 2, 900 students (1,530 boys and 1,370 girls) in sixteen target schools. TASS conducted monthly community dialogue for separate groups in targeted regions reaching 4,600 participants.

FGM Zero Tolerance Intervention



The project titled Accelerating Change towards Zero Tolerance to Female Genital Mutilation/Cutting through the policy determination, religious and community influential leaders, and community dialogues conversation, the project main objective was to abandon FGM practices in at local level through community empowerment in Bari and Karkaar regions of Puntland. Different activities were implemented addressing the attitude change for prevention and response for survivors.

> Key Achievements

TASS in collaboration MOWDAFA, local authority members and community leaders has made greater achievement in community attitude change and response as follows; during the project period, TASS TASS identified 30 community dialogue facilitators and change agents including teachers in targeted communities, who are involved in monthly community dialogue facilitation as community level. It also trained 30 men/boy role models on FGM abandonment, the trainees showed commitment to disseminate the messages through targeting university students, and young people through undertaking peer to peer awareness reaching out the communities and FGM abandonment messages in local media reached 1,080 people (648 male and 432 female). Likely, the empowered FGM district teams conducted three events that reached out 1347 people (female 777, 220 girls Boys 152, Men 198) communities from Dhudhub, Wardheer, Moqor and Libow, Laasa Dawaco, Geesa Qabad, Dhaxan and Jiingada that reported high prevalence of FGM practice. In addition, four targeted schools students shown creativity to speed up FGM risks awareness at school level. 40 families publicly declared abandonment of Female Genital Mutilation. Finally 60 FGM survivors received medical, psychosocial support and trained on livelihood skills have recovered well and their lifestyle had improved physically and emotionally and they are living now healthy life.

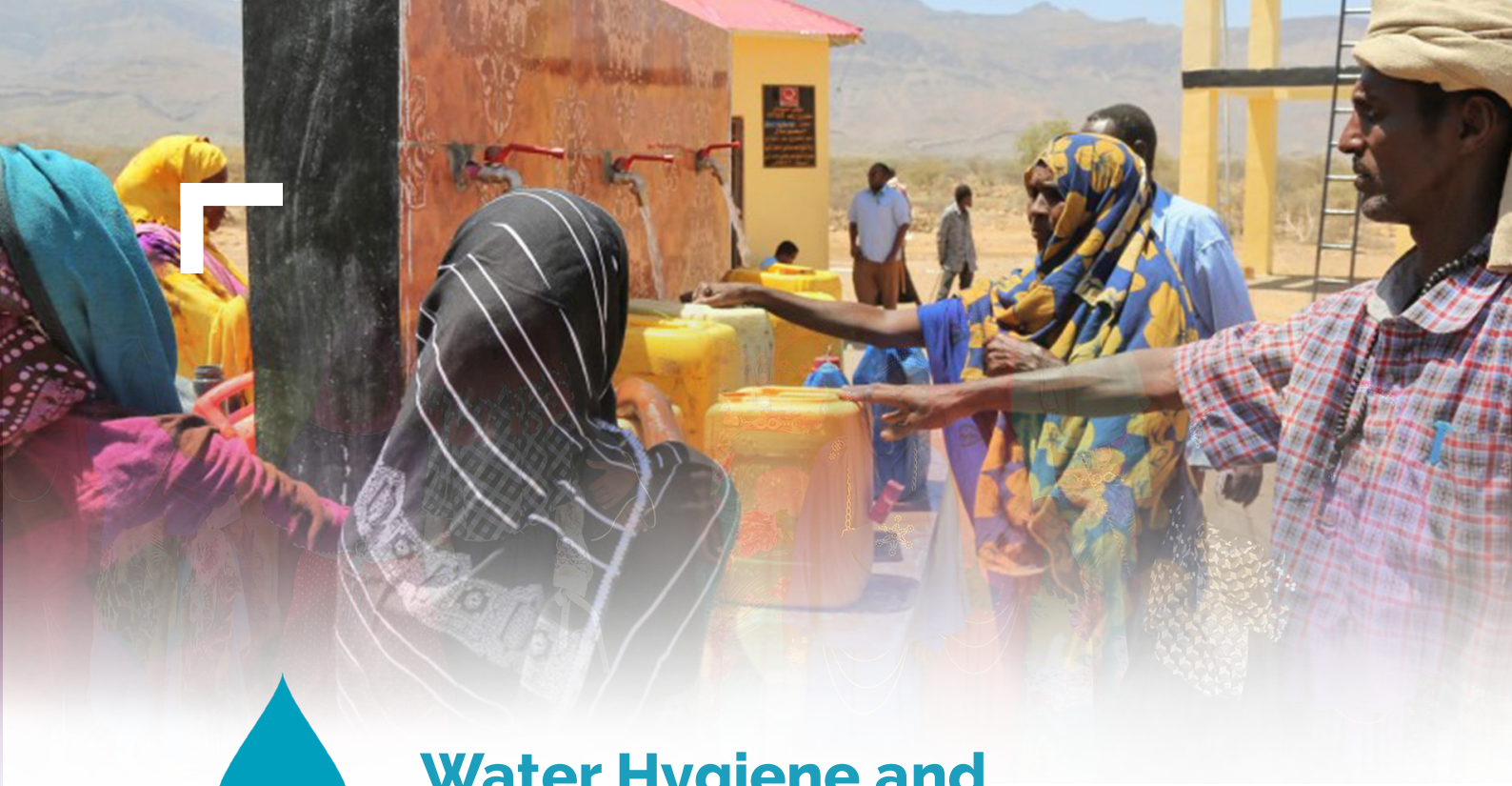

To minimize poverty by concentrating resources on young orphaned children in ways that empower them educationally, economically, and socially. TASS believes that when a child's environment provides the opportunity for physical, cognitive, social and emotional development, it will impact his or her entire life for the better. TASS advocated and fundraised for orphaned children to reduce the socio-economic impact of orphans and vulnerable children (OVC) targeted by the project. This has increased community capacity to coordinate care and support services for OVCs and caregivers.

› Key Achievements

TASS orphaned project has improved the individual and family life of orphans and vulnerable children at all project sites in Puntland. 977 orphans and 202 vulnerable children in quarterly basis fees of 90 dollar for each to support they lives and education of the children this supported and general health care, food and nutrition support, education, practical material support as well as emotional and spiritual care they have restored the self-esteem, dignity, life prospects and hope of children and their caregivers. It also has contributed directly to the interpersonal and functional capacity of orphaned and vulnerable children and as well as their guardians.



Water Hygiene and Sanitation (WASH)



Safe drinking water and basic sanitation are critical to human health and development, of continuous access to adequate quantities of safe drinking water can contribute to increased burdens of morbidity and mortality, particularly among children under the age of five. The objective of the Project is to increase access to safe drinking water and improved sanitation in the rural areas.

› Key Achievements

TASS in collaboration with Puntland water agency did assessment on water needs in three locations Falay-ryaale, buurawadal and Godqaboobe in Sool region to prioritize the community water needs, finally selected Godqaboobe village where there had no water source around the village, TASS contracted water drilling company which drilled water well, constructed elevated Water tank, water kiosks and animal troughs Clean, safe and portable drinking water has been installed successfully the estimated beneficiaries of this water well is 24,000 people in around the village.

Water tracking is done for sixteen schools for six months reached beneficiaries of 2,900 students every child received 2.5liter of clean water per day

TASS has also constricted twin latrines for eleven schools in Sool, Bari, and Sanaaag regions to improve the sanitation of the students in targeted schools is 4,140 students, teachers and other staff in schools benefited this project.

Food Security and Livelihood



The main objective of this sector is to improve food security such as nutrition and skills training for livelihood earning purposes for vulnerable community members. These projects have changed the poorer socio-economic conditions of target communities by ensuring they receive nutrition food and skills training, to be able to engage in having improved livelihood techniques. The project seeks to provide a better livelihood for poorer families by increasing their productivity, enhancing their network and increasing their income.

› Key Achievements

Provision of food: The main objective behind the feeding scheme was for vulnerable community members to have nutritious meals. The provided food included a school feeding program in which we targeted 2,900 children in sixteen schools and provision of 200 metric tons of food packages for vulnerable households including IDPs. 4,600 households received family food in Bosaso, Garowe and Galkayo.

Occasional projects Qurbani and Iftar; TASS provided occasional Qurbani (4,600 goat meat) to 5,200 most vulnerable households in Qardho, Bosaso and Garowe in collaboration with local authority. This has highly supported the livelihood of the community members. Likely in the holy Ramadan month TASS provided cooked meals for 2,000 families.

Skills training: This is a very prestigious project for TASS for the empowerment of women for their daily needs. TASS provided tailoring skills training for 30 women as per their desire and able to provide livelihood support to become self-reliant and self-independent. Due to these extraordinary vocational skills, women are able to send their children to schools regularly and providing educational support in time.

Conclusion



Supervision and Coordination: TASS carried out the site supervision of all the activities as they progressed with the objective of ensuring that only quality work was done. The supervision also entailed ensuring that the right services are offered to the beneficiaries. Coordination involved working with the line ministries, partners, beneficiaries and community leaders to ensure the success and sustainability of its humanitarian intervention. To address the challenges and opportunities TASS will build on its work in the future in lining with relative humanitarian situations to offer relevant services for the vulnerable populations in its geographic coverage areas

Recommendations: TASS appreciates humanitarian support by the donors and partners and it respectfully encourages them to allocate plenty support funds for most vulnerable communities in Somalia who are impacted by critical humanitarian situations or crises to recover and enable them build their resilience.
